

## **MERGER ANNOUNCEMENT**

Competition and Consumer Protection Commission clears proposed acquisition of FEI Company by Thermo Fisher Scientific Inc.

The Competition and Consumer Protection Commission yesterday cleared the proposed transaction whereby Thermo Fisher Scientific Inc. would acquire sole control of FEI Company. The proposed transaction was notified under the Competition Act 2002 (as amended) on 27 June 2016.

The Commission has formed the view that the proposed transaction will not substantially lessen competition in any market for goods or services in the State. The Commission will publish the reasons for its determination on its website no later than 60 working days after the date of the determination and after allowing the parties the opportunity to request that confidential information be removed from the published version.
