What is Competition Law?

Competition law prohibits businesses from:

Entering into anti-competitive agreements

or concerted engagement practices

Competition law applies not only to formal agreements

Also informal arrangements

Written or verbal agreements

The CCPC is responsible for enforcing Irish and EU competition law



Competition Law: Key Points

Areas of most engagement with traders

Not acting independently in setting prices or conditions of services



What to look out for?

Abuse of dominance i.e. predatory pricing, exclusive dealings, refusal to supply

Anti-Competitive Agreements i.e. agreements incorporating long exclusivity periods

Cartels i.e. market-sharing where competitors divide up locations or customers among themselves



How to make sure your business complies with competition law?

Act Independently

It is vital to encourage a culture of compliance in your business.



How can you ensure you are complying with consumer protection law?

Don't engage in misleading commercial practices

The goods you sell must comply with the general safety requirements
