I am writing in response to the Public Consultation on the Irish Household Waste Collection Market.

I wish to make the following points.

As a member of my local community, I strongly oppose any proposed change from competition 'in the market' to competition 'for the market'.

- 1. Under a competition for the market structure, competition and choice will be reduced leading to one or two operators becoming dominant. This will lead to monopolistic/Cartel markets, resulting in price increases, reduced competition etc. Businesses will close, jobs will be lost, costs will increase, and there will be no benefit to customers or the community.
- 2. There is no evidence in your discussion document of any problem that can't be resolved under the current structures.
- 3. There is currently much competition in the market which keeps prices down for customers and provides gainful employment in my community for a great many people.
- 4. My local waste collection business employs local people and these jobs would be at risk if competition for the market was introduced.
- 5. These people and their families depend on the survival of their local waste collection business.
- 6. The waste collection business gets a lot of bad press and politicians continuously try to use the waste industry as a political football.
- 7. Right now, the current system is working well.
- 8. Since private industry put the local authorities out of business 10 years ago, by offering more competitive prices and a better service, prices have not increased in those 10 years and service has increased and improved. Along with my normal waste and recycling collections, I now get my compost and glass collected. I frequently get text messages relating to collection service around bank holidays, poor weather conditions impacting on service or if a truck breaks down or is delayed and my collection day has to be re-scheduled. There has been no additional charge for this service even though the collection service being provided has improved and doubled.
- 9. There is no evidence that a change in structure wouldn't lead to greater or unforeseen problems.
- 10. The loss to my community and the local economy as a result of a company closure and resultant job losses would be devastating.
