In relation to the CCPC Public Consultation regarding the Irish Household Waste Collection Market, by way of submission Stream BioEnergy supports the attached submission from the Irish Waste Management Association (IWMA).

We would like to highlight one exception in relation to the IWMA response to Question 2.5 (d) set out at page 12 of the attached document. In our experience long-term waste supply contracts are required to secure investment in large scale waste treatment infrastructure. However, such arrangements are possible in the current market structure and we have previously secured long-term waste supply contracts for proposed AD treatment plants in Dublin and Cork, both of which have a design capacity of 90ktpa.

Stream BioEnergy is an independent, Irish owned, renewable energy development company with an emphasis on delivering infrastructure to process organic waste in Ireland. We recently completed the construction of a €30m AD facility at Ballymena, Northern Ireland that is now in full operation and generating 3MW of renewable electricity. We are also progressing plans to develop a large scale AD plant (90ktpa) in Little Island, Cork and all necessary regulatory consents have been secured for this project. When operational this plant will generate 4MW of electricity from 90ktpa of organic wastes.
