

Retailer Guide – Electrical products


An electrical charger must have a **CE mark**. The CE mark must be a minimum of 5mm high and in the form shown in this diagram.



The registered company **name** and **address** of the products' 'Manufacturer' and the 'EU Importer' must be provided on the product, its labelling, and/or its packaging (English and/or Irish language only).



Electrical chargers must be supplied with a user/instruction/safety manual. This manual must include appropriate warnings and information on conditions and limitations of product use. This will detail how to use the charger safely, basic electrical safety guidance and details of how to safely dispose of the charger. The manual must be in proper, unbroken English and/or Irish.

The manufacturer's identifying product name and EAN/MODEL code or number must be on the product, its labelling and/or its packaging. This name and code or number will be used to trace the product to the EU Declaration of Conformity and all safety testing reports.

As a retailer, you are responsible for ensuring that products sourced for resale come from reputable and established suppliers. Such suppliers should have no hesitation in providing conformity documentation for any product (i.e. an EU Declaration of Conformity and all safety testing reports).

Note: You are legally required to identify your supply chain!



The law

As a business placing or making electrical products available on the market in Ireland, you are legally required to comply with the essential health and safety requirements of the [European Union \(Low Voltage Electrical Equipment\) Regulations 2016](#). You have a duty of care to your customers and you may be held accountable for any electrical product which you place or make available on the market.

I have been provided with an EU Declaration of Conformity for these products.		
I know where to request safety testing reports from, if they are required by the Authorities.		
I am satisfied that the price I am paying for these products, does not make me question the authenticity of these products.
